

Write to your Illinois state legislators to tell them the Department of Ag's requirements do not protect Illinois Citizen's rights

House Bill 5637 would change the LMFA (Livestock Management Facilities Act) so that county boards have the authority to refuse new factory farm proposals and neighboring residents have the right to call for public hearings on new applications. Local citizens would also have the right to challenge IDOA siting decisions if a factory farm proposal does not meet the requirements of the law. The bill would also increase siting setbacks from towns, neighboring residences and waterways since factory farm pollution rarely remains within the confines of the property on which these facilities are located. Write your legislators and ask them to support the bill. This bill will give more rights to the individual counties. 
